If you wish to organise a conference panel, please email the conference organisers regarding the theme and panellists' names. Proposed panels should comprise of four separate papers. All panellists should submit individual abstracts before the deadline.

Registration will cost €60. It gives postgraduates one year's membership in the Society for Terrorism Research for 2024. Non-presenting attendees also need to pay registration fees.
